Delhi. 3. In his letter, Shri Ramani Ranjan Das has made two complaints. One is that no proper action has been taken against Bhandari against William D action has been taken against Shandari against whom he had a previous complaint which was the subject matter of your D.C.No.2(64)/56-63-PM dated 25rd May 1963. We had sent a reply to this, vide D.O.Ho.III(51)/63(6) dated 12th June, 1963; in which we had mentioned the facts of the case. There is nothing more to be reported as no legal action is possible against Bhandari. 4. The second complaint by Ramani Ranjan Das, as unde in his letter, is that a false case has been engineered against the immates of Shaulmari Ashran by the Jalpaiguri Police. In this connection please see the enclosed cony of the letter from the West Bengal I.B. 5. In his letter, Shri Malhotra has asked the Irime Minister to officially recognise the Shaulmari Sadhu as Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. This claim is quite false and the Shaulmari Sadhu himself does not claim any connection with Netaji. Enclosed is a coly of the English translation of the Bengali Leaflet published from the Shaulmari Askram in which it has been categorically stated that Shaulmari Sadhu is not Subhas Chandra Bose. This should falsify Shri Malhotra's claim. But, unfortunately, there are people in India, including some in leading positions in public life, who want to exploit Netaji's name. They have been propagating since the last 14 years that the Netaji would return A propaganda was even started when the Chinese invade our country last year that Netaji was coming with the invading army. This group, whose leadership has been taken by the All-India Subhasbadi Janata still goes on propagating that the Shaulmari Sadh is none other than Netaji, though, as I have mentage above, the Sadhu himself is quite annoyed with this propaganda and categorically denies that he is Netaji. dire /
